

# HISTORY OF "TULSA TIME"

From Indian Territory to oil boomtown, Tulsa has experienced many changes over the generations. Settled in the 1800s by Native American tribes traveling west, Tulsa is deeply rooted in Native American heritage, oil, arts and culture.


Take a stroll down memory lane and check out a few fun facts of how this beautiful area became a booming metropolis.

If you're interested in learning more about Tulsa and looking for a day activity, visit the Tulsa Historical Society. Exhibits ranging from sportstheme, modern culture and oil history rotate through the museum. For more information, go to www.tulsahistory.org.

Modern-day "Tulsa" derives from the Lochapoka word, "Tulasi." The name was given upon settling the land in 1836 at a site near present-day Cheyenne Ave. and 18th street. In this place, under a large burr oak tree, the Lochapoka, a clan of the Creek Indians, established their home. The ceremonial tree is still standing in what is now called, "Creek Nation Council Oak Park." Visitors are invited to have a picnic and/or stroll through this beautiful park in downtown Tulsa.



The 1990s placed Tulsa on the roadmap to success in the 21st century. Through its perseverant nature, Tulsa attracted key industries and businesses to the region. Most notably, Tulsa became the home for several factories and telecommunication centers. The renaissance was beginning and Tulsa's economy was rising.



**Around 1901,** Tulsa rapidly grew from a small frontier town to a booming community with the discovery of "black gold," otherwise known as oil. Investors flooded into the city, neighborhoods sprang up and Tulsa started taking

shape. Visitors can still drive through Red Fork (West Tulsa) and see the site of the first oil well in Tulsa County.



The **"roaring twenties"** played a huge role in shaping the design of many Tulsa buildings. Oil money was plentiful and thus the art-deco feel of Tulsa came alive. Today, visitors can stroll neighborhoods and streets of downtown to witness the grandeur of this generation.


In the 1950s Tulsa was dubbed, "America's Most Beautiful City." With the mansions built in the 20s and an urban renewal initiative to build parks and attractions, Tulsa embraced its beauty and became an example of culture and fine living.

In the 1980s Tulsa experienced an oil bust. At that point, Tulsans became known for their perseverance and proved this would not shut their city down. Through initiatives by the people of Tulsa, the city started attracting new industries. Previous attractions were remodeled and Tulsans were beginning the change toward large city amenities and a small town feel.

Today the region is thriving and Tulsa is on the map for travelers worldwide. "It's Everything Else That's Different" has become the motto for travel within the region. Tulsa has the amenities of a large city, while holding on to the "Up Close & Personal" feel. Tulsa continues to grow and attractions are being added.



In the early 2000s, Tulsans came together and passed "Vision 2025." The capital gains package led to a renaissance throughout the region, specifically in downtown Tulsa. The nationally-famed BOK Center was built and attracted the WNBA and numerous large-scale entertainment events. The BOK center was just part of the overall renaissance around downtown Tulsa. The Brady Arts district started booming and ONEOK Field was constructed and businesses began migrating back to the heart of the city.



# **DOWNTOWN** -YOUR CORE TULSA EXPERIENCE

No better blend of the past, present and future can be found than in downtown Tulsa. Architectural marvels from the 1920s house modern concept bars and restaurants while the dust of new construction swirls in the air in Tulsa's busy city center. Each downtown district has a different and distinct personality, providing visitors abundant options for experiencing a memorable stay.

# **BRADY ARTS DISTRICT** THEBRADYARTSDISTRICT.COM

One of the oldest and most historic sections of Tulsa, this district is home to art galleries, shops, restaurants and nightclubs, and historic entertainment venues The Brady Theater and Cain's Ballroom. Much of the growth of downtown in the past few years has centered in Brady, which is known for its red brick buildings. Both residents and visitors enjoy the new Guthrie Green, an urban garden and performance space, home to "Food Truck Wednesdays."

### **BLUE DOME BLUEDOMETULSA.COM**

A center for Tulsa nightlight, this district is named after the distinctive "bluedomed" building at the corner of Second and Elgin. Blue Dome serves a young crowd attracted to pubs, restaurants, clubs and the live music scene. But Blue Dome in the day is perfect for any visitor to Tulsa – with its outdoor gear stores, bowling alley and Tulsa- and Oklahomainspired retailers.

# BOK CENTER DISTRICT

This growing district features the awardwinning BOK Center arena, which brings in the nation's top-billing artists, and the recently renovated Cox Business Center. The downtown skyline's most

recent addition is the \$100 million mixed-use property One Place with space for retail, restaurants and commercial properties.

# DECO DISTRICT DECODISTRICTTULSA.COM

The visually stunning architecture in the Deco District can't be missed. Tulsa is a city founded by entrepreneurs and oil barons, and their contributions can be seen in the Art Deco buildings for which downtown Tulsa is known. The Tulsa Historical Society and private tour companies provide art deco walking tours. But as is Tulsa's style, old blends perfectly with new in the Deco, as many new restaurants, shops and a park are popping up.



A beacon of hope and healing, the John Hope Franklin Reconciliation Park features three bronze sculptures representing actual pictures from the 1921 Tulsa Race Riot, one of the worst civic disturbances in American history. A 25-foot memorial tower depicts the history of the African American struggle from Africa to America.

Just on the east outskirts of downtown lies one of the city's oldest neighborhoods. Recent revitalization efforts have brought increased activity to the area, and visitors can enjoy a beautiful park with a walking/ jogging trail, a new corner café and more.

# WHAT IS ART DECO?

Tulsans like to brag about their unique architecture style. In fact, Tulsa has one of the largest concentrations of art deco architecture in the U.S., behind only New York and Miami. But what is Art Deco, and why are we so proud of it?

Art Deco is a decorative art style of the 1920s and '30s characterized by precise and boldly delineated geometric shapes and strong colors. The timing of the style was perfect for Tulsa, then known as the "Oil Capital of the World." Tulsa was experiencing unprecedented growth and oil barons had money to invest. Thankfully for today's Tulsans and the many visitors we welcome into the community, those oil tycoons built skyscrapers that embodied the zigzag, streamlined style of Art Deco.

Our Art Deco legacy is most concentrated in downtown Tulsa, but examples of it can be found across the city in schools, churches, theaters, private homes and office buildings.

# **ARTS IN TULSA**



Numerous Oklahoma museums and cultural institutions have partnered with the Oklahoma Museums Association to present Celebrating Allan Houser: An Oklahoma Perspective, which recognizes the 100th anniversary of Houser's birth. The

celebration features exhibitions and events across the state through December 2014 to honor the Oklahoma native.

**Gilcrease Museum** is participating in the centennial celebration by presenting a broad selection of his sculptures in Form and Line: Allan Houser's Sculpture and Drawings. This exhibition opened Feb. 13 and ends June 29, 2014. Monumental and tabletop sculptures in this special exhibition reveal the range of Houser's extraordinary talent. Large charcoal and pastel drawings on display inform the sculpture, yet are finished artworks in themselves.

Gilcrease Museum is fortunate to have some of Houser's works. The Sacred Rain Arrow, one of his best-known pieces, commands a central point in front of the museum and embellishes Oklahoma's license plates. The exhibition of Houser's sculptures is a great opportunity to see some of his most iconic work. In conjunction with the rest of the venues in the Houser centennial collaboration. Oklahomans have a once-in-a lifetime opportunity to see the breadth of one of America's finest artists.



Gilcrease Museum

Gilcrease Museum is one of the country's best facilities for the preservation and study of American art and history.

In addition to the Houser exhibition, visitors to the museum should be sure to see two new installations: On Common Ground and Focus on Favorites: Masterworks from the Gilcrease Collection, which together present a treasure of art, artifacts and historical documents. The museum's founder, Thomas Gilcrease, amassed an extraordinary collection that was lifetime and has become known as one of America's finest museums.

Gilcrease Museum is one of the country's best facilities for the preservation and study of American art and history. The museum houses the world's largest and most comprehensive collection of art and artifacts of the American West, including an unparalleled collection of Native American art and artifacts, as well as thousands of historic documents, maps and manuscripts. The museum is owned by the City of Tulsa, which has partnered with The University of Tulsa to steward the museum.

# GILCREASE MUSEUM HOURS ARE:

addition to exceptional temporary and permanent exhibitions, the museum features themed gardens that have been developed on 23 of the museum's 460 acres. The Restaurant at Gilcrease serves lunch Tuesday-Saturday, 11 a.m. to 3 p.m., and offers a Sunday brunch.

# IT ALL STARTED WITH A GIFT

In 1938 Waite and Genevieve Phillips donated their 72-room mansion, known as Villa Philbrook, toward the formation of Tulsa's first art museum. Seventy-five years later, Philbrook brings together nationally recognized permanent art collections, Gilded Age architecture, 23 acres of immaculate gardens, and the experience of a modern museum complex across two distinct locations.

Philbrook Downtown (116 E. M.B. Brady St.) One of the greatest 20th century Native American jewelers of all time, Charles Loloma (Hopi, 1921-1991) revolutionized Native art through the use of nontraditional materials and techniques.

Philbrook Downtown (116 E. M.B. Brady St.) Although known for his sculpture, Oklahoma artist Allan Houser (Apache, 1914-1994) began his career as a painter. This exhibition draws works from the 1940s-70s in honor of the 100th

# THE BRADY **ARTS DISTRICT**

The creative soul will find excitement in The Brady Arts District in downtown Tulsa. This revitalized and walkable district holds entertainment and arts for all. Visitors will find art galleries, glassblowing, chocolate making, unique shops, restaurants and a vibrant nightlife to enjoy.

The Brady Arts District is also home to the Tulsa Paper Company. Originally constructed in 1922, it now houses 80,000 square feet of gallery space and arts programming.




Visitors will find art galleries, glassblowing, chocolate making, unique shops, restaurants and a vibrant nightlife to enjoy.

# PHILBROOK DOWNTOWN

PHILBROOK.ORG Philbrook Downtown features 30,000 square feet of modern gallery space designed by Gluckman Mayner Architects within Mathews Warehouse, a renovation project initiated by the George Kaiser Family Foundation. Recently opened in June 2013, this extension of the main Philbrook campus showcases 20th and 21st century art including one of the finest surveys of 20th century Native American art anywhere.

# WOODY GUTHRIE CENTER

WOODYGUTHRIECENTER.ORG Woody Guthrie was one of America's greatest folksingers and most influential songwriters. Opened in 2013, the Woody Guthrie Center houses archives, a section devoted to the Dust Bowl and Guthrie's ballads, a music bar, lyric writing station, Guthrie's instruments and more.

# HENRY ZARROW CENTER FOR ART AND EDUCATION GILCREASE.ORG

This dynamic arts anchor serves The University of Tulsa's School of Art, Division of Lifelong Learning and Gilcrease Museum. The three-story Zarrow Center spans 18,000 square feet and includes classrooms, art studios and gallery space where the public can enjoy exhibits in a social setting. Special exhibitions are featured in the Sherman Smith Family Gallery, including shows featuring the artwork of TU students and local artists.

# **SHERWIN MILLER MUSEUM OF JEWISH ART** IEWISHMUSEUM.NET

This museum contains the Southwest's finest collection of Judaica, including priceless items nearly 4,000 years old. An extraordinary Holocaust Collection emphasizes the experiences of survivors who came to live in Oklahoma, as well as Oklahomans who participated in the liberation of the Nazi concentration camps.

# **ARTS & HUMANITIES COUNCIL OF TULSA** HARDESTY ARTS CENTER (AHHA) AHCT.ORG

A new addition to downtown Tulsa, the AHHA is a four-floor, 42,000-squarefoot building that houses gallery space, a variety of studios and classrooms and a stage for performances. Artists in residence have studios to work, teach and learn, and hundreds of schoolchildren and adults can visit daily. Entrance is free and open to the public.

# LIVING ARTS OF TULSA LIVINGARTS.ORG

Living Arts offers creative workshops, performances, exhibitions, films/ videos, demonstrations of current art, lectures, related educational activities and research in its mission to present and develop contemporary art forms in Tulsa.



SOCIETY MUSEUM TULSAHISTORY.ORG

Recently located in its new home the Samuel Travis Mansion, the museum holds an extensive collection of resources on Tulsa's rich and diverse past. The collection contains nearly 5,000 photos, books, maps, historical costumes, architectural elements, and fine and decorative arts. In addition, the Museum's Vintage Garden invites visitors to stroll among the flowers.

# **CIRCLE CINEMA**

Nestled just off Route 66 and listed on the National Register of Historic Places, you will find Tulsa's own Circle Cinema. The Circle Cinema is Tulsa's independent and non-profit art-house movie theatre, showing independent, foreign and documentary films. Films at the cinema also include locally produced and directed films festivals and those created by filmmaking classes.

Occupying a half city block in Tulsa's historic downtown, the Performing Arts Center is the design of Minoru Yamasaki, architect of the former World Trade Center towers. The PAC houses four theaters, a studio space and a large




# **CYRUS AVERY CENTENNIAL PLAZA**





Tulsa is located within a region known fittingly as Green Country, where nature lovers feel right at home.

# WATER PLAY

Northeast Oklahoma encompasses thousands of miles of lakeshore, most within a short driving distance of the Tulsa area. Just a short drive from downtown Tulsa, you can watch bald eagles on the hunt at Keystone Lake, fish at Skiatook Lake, camp at Oologah Lake or go scuba diving in the waters of Lake Tenkiller.

The vast expanses of lakes Ft. Gibson, Grand and Eufaula make them a boater's paradise. To the east, the Illinois River offers enchanting scenery and superb facilities for canoeing, camping and weekend float trips.

# **RIVERPARKS**

Without a doubt, one of Tulsa's outdoor highlights is **RiverParks**, a strip of unspoiled land along the Arkansas River and a testament to visionary urban planning.

Stretching southward from downtown, RiverParks offers more than 25 miles of asphalt-surfaced trails, several recreation areas, scenic

overlooks, a disc golf course and excellent fishing. The low-water dam and pedestrian bridge make for attractive scenery, and the QuikTrip Plaza at 41st Street and Riverside draws visitors and families with its water features and playgrounds. RiverParks is also home to the city's largest collection of bronze wildlife sculptures and other art. Find out more at RiverParks.org.

# PARKS AND REC

Just to the east, and celebrated for their exceptional landscaping, are Woodward Park and the Municipal Rose Garden. Just northwest of downtown is the Oklahoma Centennial Botanical

Gardens with 170 acres of



unspoiled land, nature trails and the Osage Hills open Saturdays April through October each year.

And no matter where you stay, there's bound to be a beautiful park nearby; the City of Tulsa Parks Department oversees 8,200 acres of park land and 140 parks.

For cyclists, Tulsa certainly doesn't disappoint. RiverParks' trails are ideal for a flat surface, but for a slightly more rugged terrain, check out the **Turkey** Mountain Urban Wilderness Area, with 300 acres of heavily-wooded crests and valleys connected by a maze of dirt trails coveted by mountain bikers, cross-country runners and equestrians.

And there's likely to be a 5k race on any given weekend in Tulsa, but two racing events have become tradition: the Tulsa Run in October, and the Route 66 Marathon in November.

# IN GREEN COUNTRY



Oklahoma is known for more miles of fresh-water shoreline than any other state in the country. Not only that, but Green Country is home to some of the most premier fishing destinations around. When angling for your prize-winning bass, remember this region has a few fishing holes for you to enjoy.

Created to assist with the preservation of these fishing hotspots, the Grand River Dam Authority, also known as GRDA, strives to sustain this region's lakes for fishing and outdoor enthusiasts. GRDA oversees nearly 70,000 acres of water in northeast Oklahoma. The thousands of acres of water are comprised of areas connected to the Grand River. Two main fishing and outdoor recreation lakes are within an hour's drive of Tulsa.

The largest lake in the region was created in 1940 with GRDA's completion of the Pensacola Dam. Grand Lake O' The Cherokees is 46,500 surface acres of water and ideal for fishing, boating, skiing, swimming and sailing. The 1,300 miles of shoreline meandering through the

foothills of the Ozark mountains are full of secluded coves, perfect for baiting your next big catch. Grand Lake is consistently ranked among the top lakes for bass fishing in the region.

Just downstream from Grand Lake, you will find one of northeast Oklahoma's best-kept secrets, Lake Hudson. Significantly smaller than its "big sister," Grand Lake O' The Cherokees, Lake Hudson has 12,000 acres of surface water and nearly 200 miles of shoreline. Many fishing enthusiasts consider the lake to have the best bass fishing in Oklahoma. While there, cast your line for sand bass, crappie, perch and/or catfish.

With its distinctive 15-story tower reaching heavenward, Boston Avenue United Methodist Church is an exquisite example of Art Deco architecture. Completed in 1929, the building was designed by Dr. Adah Robinson and translated into architectural drawings by Bruce Goff.

# CHEROKEE TOURISM CHEROKEETOURISMOK.COM

Discover the amazing heritage of the Cherokee Nation in Oklahoma. Cherokee Tourism operates tours including stops at the Cherokee Heritage Center and Museum, which houses the Trail of Tears exhibit; an Ancient Village; and Adam's Corner Rural Village. Guests may also visit the Murrell Home, the only antebellum plantation home left in Oklahoma. Enjoy Tahlequah, the capital city of the great Cherokee Nation, while touring historic properties including the Cherokee National Supreme Court and Cherokee National Jail.

Guided tours are available by reservation.

# MABEL B. LITTLE HERITAGE HOUSE MUSEUM AND GREENWOOD CULTURAL CENTER

Formerly the home of Sam and Lucy Mackey, the Mabel B. Little Heritage House was built in the 1920s and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Known as "Black Wall Street," Tulsa's Greenwood District once stretched for 20 blocks and was the largest and richest of Oklahoma's 50 black communities. Today, the Greenwood Cultural Center and the Mabel B. Little Heritage House present a permanent history of the district.

# ORAL ROBERTS UNIVERSITY PRAYER TOWER & WILLARD ELSING MUSEUM ELSING.ORU.EDU

A heart-stirring memorial of a trying portion of Tulsa's history, the JHF Reconciliation Park was built in commemoration of the 1921 Tulsa Race Riot, one of the worst civic disturbances in American history. Hope Plaza, a 16foot granite structure with three bronze sculptures, depicts actual pictures from the 1921 riot. The Tower of Reconciliation at the center of the park is a 25-foot memorial tower that displays the early struggles of Oklahoma Territory and the lively history of Black Wall Street in Greenwood.

# **OXLEY NATURE CENTER** OXLEYNATURECENTER.ORG

Nature is never far away in Tulsa. At the Oxley Nature Center, in Mohawk Park, you'll love exploring the trails that wind through this 800-acre wildlife sanctuary. There's nothing like a walk in the woods to enliven the senses and bring some peace to our busy lives. Be sure to enjoy all of the varied plant life and animal life that call this sanctuary home. Bird-watching excursions, like those on Saturday mornings, are popular so bring your binoculars and your desire to spot a rare species or two.


# **MUSKOGEE**




